OVERVIEW

The Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) aims to develop a robust service response that provides a genuine offer of support for people at the highest risk of involvement in gun violence.

The goal of the RFP is to build the capacity of community-based providers to offer case management and conduct street outreach to this high-risk population.



WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Service providers in Baltimore City with extensive case management and street outreach experience who have a track record of working with people at highest risk of involvement in gun violence.

WHAT IS THE TARGET POPULATION?

Applicants should have experience serving clients with the following considerations: on parole or probation; have criminal records and/or active warrants; have a history of being engaged in gun activity and/or associates closely with known turfs, groups, gangs involved in violent activity; disconnected from traditional institutions (e.g. schools or workforce); not proactive in follow through or engaging services; history of trauma and exposure to violence; primarily over 24 years old.

WHAT ARE THE ANTICIPATED SERVICE NEEDS?

Applicants should demonstrate experience connecting individuals to various service types. This will require the service provider to manage a network of community-based partners providing responses to the following direct service needs: transitional employment and training; housing stabilization; health care; transportation assistance; substance use and behavioral health; re-entry support; cognitive behavioral therapy; safety planning; other soft skills and supportive services, as needed.

CAN I APPLY IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ANOTHER ORGANIZATION?

Partnerships are encouraged to ensure applications include robust case management and street outreach expertise. Application must clearly articulate which organization will serve as the main point of contact for the grant and describe the sub-contracting agreements that will be implemented.

HOW CAN I LEARN MORE?
